

Melanoma! Now What?

With the rapid evolution of systemic treatment for melanoma and ongoing debate around what the best management approach is, it is unsurprising that there is confusion amongst practitioners regarding what to do when a melanoma is suspected. One of the keys to being able to provide appropriate melanoma management is being able to accurately assess the primary melanoma.



Shave vs excision

A shave biopsy for a lesion can be an efficient way to diagnose and treat lesions. When performed with melanoma, however, it can transect the base of the lesion and disrupt the ability to accurately determine the Breslow thickness of the melanoma, which could potentially affect management decisions and prognostic information. The recommendation remains to do an excisional biopsy for any suspected melanoma. In situations where an excisional biopsy is not possible, for example large facial lesions, then representative biopsies that include the full

thickness of the dermis and upper subcutis are acceptable.

One of the toughest things patients go through is the anxiety associated with the diagnosis, especially when they have been googling "stage 4" disease after being informed of their "level 4" melanoma on biopsy. Clarke level is an outdated tool to describe the level of invasion of melanoma that has no bearing on clinical decision making or prognostic significance and can cause unnecessary stress to patients. It is worth clarifying the difference between having a Clarke level 4 melanoma and stage 4 metastatic disease.

Scans – should I scan my patient?

Anyone with suspect stage 3 disease should undergo imaging to identify any metastatic disease. CT head / neck / chest / abdomen and pelvis is readily accessible and can help to identify obvious metastatic disease, however PET CT is a more sensitive investigation. Suspected brain metastases are best defined using MRI. Consideration can be given to patients with stage 2c disease (primary melanomas >4mm with ulceration) as they are high risk for having metastases at presentation.

The downside to scanning patients with thinner melanomas is the potential to identify abnormalities that turn out to be harmless after a lot of unnecessary investigations and anxiety. Furthermore, exposure to radiation can increase the risk of cancer developing in the future, as well as the development of cataracts.

Sentinel Node Bx

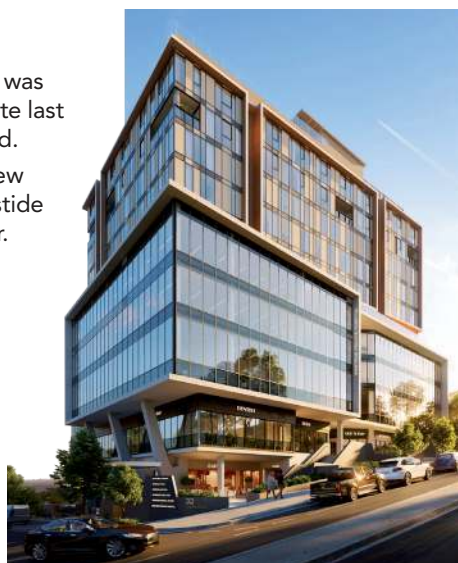
The option of having a sentinel node biopsy should be discussed with patients with a melanoma of Breslow thickness >1mm or >0.75mm with high risk pathological features prior to wide local excision. Once a WLE has been performed there is potential for the true lymphatic drainage of that lesion to be disrupted and for the accuracy of the sentinel node biopsy to be compromised. The difficulty with performing sentinel node biopsy is that there is no direct evidence to prove that there is any survival benefit from it or subsequent completion lymph node dissection (CLND), and there can be significant side effects, particularly with CLND. A subset analysis of MSLT-1 data did show a survival lymphatic drainage of that lesion to be disrupted and for the accuracy of the sentinel node biopsy to be compromised. The difficulty with performing sentinel node biopsy is that there is no direct evidence to prove that there is any survival benefit from it or subsequent completion lymph node dissection (CLND), and there can be significant side effects, particularly with CLND. A subset analysis of MSLT-1 data did show a survival benefit in patients with positive SNBx who went on to have immediate CLND and were found to have further non-sentinel node involvement. This survival advantage applied to less than 5% of all those who underwent SNBx. We will know more about the potential benefits once the results from MSLT-2 are released, however this is still about 5 years away.

Until then, sentinel node biopsy remains a prognostic investigation only. It may be of great relevance for some to know that around 1 out of 10 people will die within 10 years if their SNBx is negative and that 3 out of 10 people will die within 10 years if it is positive. They may accept the potential complications to know that information. The other benefit of knowing the nodal status is the potential to enrol in adjuvant therapy trials. If these trials show benefit, then the future role for SNBx may be to gain access to these drugs.

Adjuvant Therapy

The development of targeted therapies and immunotherapies have been a breakthrough in the management of metastatic or unresectable melanoma. Currently, BRAF mutant melanoma is usually treated initially with BRAF +/- MEK inhibitors with

conversion to immunotherapy (CTLA-4 and PD-1 inhibitors) if disease progresses or recurs. BRAF wildtype melanomas are commenced on immunotherapy primarily. There are numerous trials looking at different combinations of these drugs that show promising improvements in outcomes, however it is still the minority of patients that have a response to therapy, and an even smaller percentage that have a total and sustained resolution of their disease. There are problems with resistance to these drugs and relapsing disease that isn't fully understood yet. And, as with all interventions, there are side effects. Until we can identify exactly who will benefit from these medications and figure out a way to control the costs involved, it will remain limited to use in patients with metastatic or unresectable melanoma.

Personalising melanoma management is the key to ensuring that every patient gets the treatment that is right for them. As practitioners we must have a thorough understanding of the current options for management in order to be able to explain the choices to patients in an effective and understandable way. The melanoma unit at the Princess Alexandra Hospital and the more recently developed melanoma multidisciplinary team at the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital offer a broad range of expertise to help manage patients diagnosed with melanoma.

How To Approach Lymphadenopathy in Adults

Lymphadenopathy is a common presentation in general practice and understanding the red flag symptoms and signs can improve treatment outcomes. The patients's clinical history and examination can be very helpful in identifying patients who need urgent assessment.

The following symptoms and signs give guidance on when to refer patients with lymphadenopathy:

1. Unexplained night sweats, fevers and weight loss
2. Persistent palpable enlarged lymph nodes >1.5cm (greater than 6 weeks)
3. Rapid growth in a lymph node site
4. Unexplained cytopenias and/or elevated LDH in association with lymphadenopathy
5. Generalised lymphadenopathy
6. Splenomegaly

The initial workup of these patients should include the following initial tests:

Excision biopsy of the lymph node for histology, flow cytometry and cytogenetics is the preferred diagnostic test. In some cases, the ability to access tissue is limited by the location of the nodes. With these cases, core biopsy via radiology guidance is appropriate. I would not suggest fine needle aspiration due to it's poor specificity in lymphoma diagnosis workup.

PET/CT is the preferred staging radiology investigation as it has enhanced sensitivity in lymphoma staging and allows better assessment of extranodal involvement. CT scans of the neck, chest abdomen and pelvis are also appropriate in some low grade lymphoma patients

FBC, ELFTS including LDH, serum EPP, Beta-2 microglobulin and serum immunoglobulins.

If the patient has a past history of malignancy, then collaboration with the treating haematologist or oncologist can also help streamline the patient's assessment.
